The University of Alberta, Faculty of Medicine & Dentistry, in partnership with Alberta Health Services, is inviting applications for a full time contingent-tenured position as the Director of the Division of Critical Care Medicine. Located in Edmonton, Alberta, the Faculty of Medicine and Dentistry ranks among the world's top 50 medical schools, and is one of Canada's premier health education and research centres. With unified health care across the province, Alberta Health Services provides a patient-focused quality health system that is accessible and sustainable for all Albertans. Critical Care Medicine is a Stand-Alone Division within the Faculty of Medicine and Dentistry and a Clinical Department within the Edmonton Zone of Alberta Health Services. The successful candidate will be the Director of the Division of Critical Care Medicine and the Zone Clinical Department Head and will report directly to the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine and Dentistry and to the Zone Medical Director, Alberta Health Services, Edmonton Zone.

There are general systems intensive care units in five hospitals in the Edmonton Zone as well as a burn unit, a neurosciences intensive care unit and a cardiac surgical intensive care unit with a total of 110 funded Level III critical care beds supporting all adult medical and surgical services, including trauma, cardiac surgery, burns, thoracic surgery, clinical neurosciences and multi-organ transplantation. The Critical Care faculty includes 47 intensivists from varied specialty backgrounds. The Division of Critical Care Medicine has a well-established Royal College training program and an established and growing clinical research program with nationally funded investigators.

The successful candidate must have suitable specialist certification in Critical Care Medicine and be eligible for licensure with the College of Physicians & Surgeons of Alberta. The ideal candidate will have a proven track record in research and leadership. Interested candidates should submit a current curriculum vitae, a separate statement outlining their leadership experience, areas of research interest, and involvement in education. Consideration of applicants will include an assessment of previous leadership, clinical and academic performance. Rank, terms of the appointment and salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Applicants should also include the names of three references (who will not be contacted without the applicant's consent). Applicants are asked to submit their documents by February 15, 2012; however, the competition will remain open until the position is filled.
